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Introduction



Results

Pregnancy is not an exclusion criterion from clinical trials unless there is a convincing scientific or ethical reason for it. Research is needed to provide women with effective, safe treatment for the fetus that would not be possible outside of the study. Ethical complexity is reflected in the need to balance the interests of the pregnant woman and the fetus.

Conclusions

The inclusion of pregnant women is guided by the protection of the human being. If the clinical study offers the potential clinical benefit to the pregnant woman, for the fetus the risk must be more than minimal.




Fig.Nr 2 Number of studies excluding and not excluding pregnant women from participation in industry-sponsored clinical studies.
